Dear Members of the Great and Little Shelford Community,

Welcome back! It has been an absolute pleasure to welcome Y1-Y6 back to school! We have also been delighted to welcome our Reception class to their Teddy Bear's Picnic on Friday and their induction sessions this and next week. Furthermore, we are thrilled to welcome Eloise and Rose to Year 2; Edward to Year 3 and Bethan to Year 4.

One of the major highlights of the return to school last week was the shared outside spaces. It was wonderful to see the cross-age play that is so characteristic of the long-standing vision of the school. This has included exploring some of the new line markings that our School Council decided on in their classes and the various other outdoor areas. We also look forward to our buddy systems returning – most notably our Y6 & Reception buddies, along with our reading buddy systems.

This week, we launched the start of our new curriculum thread *identity*. The topics for each class link to the theme of identity. This might be through how the identity of our country has been altered in history like in Y2, Y3 and Y4's topics – The Great Fire of London; What happened in 1066? and The Romans: Who were they and how did they change Britain? Alternatively, this might explore our own identity or the identity of others in some of our other topics like in Reception, Y1 and Y6's topics – Marvellous Me; Shelford Stars and HMS Beagle – why did it go where it went? (with a focus on evolution). Meanwhile, Y5 takes an even wider stance with exploring the identity of our planet within their Star Gazers topic.

## Y1 - Y6 Meet the Teacher

We wrote to families recently to outline a different approach to Meet the Teacher this year. Each class will share a presentation that summarises important information via the school website. These will be available from **13th September**. Additionally, there will be two half hour slots, where classes will be open to parents. This will be an opportunity to visit the class and meet the class teachers - **Tuesday 14th September 3:30-4:00; Thursday 16th September 3:30-4:00.**
