Great and Little Shelford CE (A) Primary School

This primary school in Cambridge is dedicated to internationalism and building relationships across the world, with partnerships in France, Canada, Kenya, Zambia, Morocco, to name a few. They are committed to encouraging learners to explore different cultures, make connections, and challenge stereotypes through their global pen pal initiatives, student letters and video meetings, as well as weekly global affairs sessions to discuss global events. They even hold an annual whole-school-community 'French Breakfast', where pupils act as French waiters, taking orders for typical French breakfast items. As well as student initiatives, teachers are encouraged to learn from each other too - they run a headteacher placement with a school in France so that they can each reflect and explore the cultural and pedagogical differences of their education systems.
