Parent briefings and celebration assemblies

I regret that, due to fire regulations, it is necessary to **limit attendance to one representative per child**. The parent briefing will begin in the hall at 2.00pm followed by a short time/conversation in classrooms with class teachers at 2.30pm. The main subject of the briefing is safeguarding, mental health and well-being. The children from both classes will then present a short musical performance in celebration assembly from 2.40pm. I do hope that you will be able to join us.

Scooter storage

Thank you for encouraging the children to be independent in parking their scooters – the system seems to be working well.

Here is a reminder of the storage process:

- Wear your backpack on two shoulders so that both hands are free
- Hang your helmet on the handlebars
- ❖ Hold the steering column and the footplate at a right angle to the rail
- ❖ Lift the scooter up so that the handlebar goes between the rails
- Turn the scooter to face the homeward direction
- Lower the scooter to sit on the rails

When retrieving your scooter:

- Wear your backpack on two shoulders so that both hands are free
- Hold the steering column and the footplate
- ❖ Lift the scooter up so that the handlebar goes between the rails
- Turn the scooter to make a right angle to the rail
- Lower the scooter to the floor
- Put your helmet on

Fairtrade Day - 1st November 2017

Our international focus for this academic year is 'Food Around the World'. We thought a great way to start would be to think about where our favourite foods actually come from and with that we thought about Fairtrade.

The day started with a glimpse at the Fairtrade mark.

Then Mr and Mrs Wilkinson from Shelford Delicatessen came in to run a fantastic Fairtrade assembly. They demonstrated the supply chain to show us how chocolate actually gets to us. At first, we were surprised to find out that not everyone in the supply chain was paid fairly. The farmer was very poorly paid and could not afford to feed, clothe and educate his family. Once Fairtrade had



been established, this meant a better deal for farmers all around the world. Now we know that when we buy Fairtrade products, farmers have been paid fairly, even if these products cost us a little bit more.

All year groups went back to their classrooms to look at Fairtrade in greater detail.

Reception and KS1 met Pablo the Super Banana! He told us all about the meaning of Fairtrade. We played Spot the Difference games and we shopped for Fairtrade foods. Reception class even made their own banana tree! We thought about our favourite meals and recorded them to send to our partner school in Kenya. We look forward to hearing back from them about typical meals they eat. We wondered if there are farming families among them who benefit from Fairtrade.

KS2 did some exciting work about the banana industry and in particular the supply chains. We thought carefully about what happens to a banana before it reaches the consumer and discussed 'who gets what' from the sale of bananas. Working is small groups, we had to allocate each other roles: banana worker, plantation owner, shipper, importer, ripener and supermarket. We were told that a banana would cost 30p and had to decide how much of that 30p we should get for our job as part of the banana chain. This fun activity taught us about how we are connected with people all around the world through the things we buy and eat.



Well done to all children for their enthusiasm and hard work during the day. A special thank you to Mr and Mrs Wilkinson for their amazing contribution to our Fairtrade Day! Look out for some Fairtrade Fundraising with help from our PTA coming soon.

DBS checks

As we begin a new half term, please note the reminder to parents/carers and our volunteer helpers about the following very important aspect of the schools Safeguarding procedures.

All volunteer helpers are required to:

- be DBS checked by the school, even if you already hold a DBS certificate from somewhere else.
- attend an induction session with Mrs Evans prior to helping within the school. Dates for future induction sessions are:
 - Thursday 11th January
 - Wednesday 28th February
 - Monday 23rd April
 - Friday 8th June

(These will all be held from 9.05 until 10.15 am)

The exception to this is if you are helping to walk children to an outside venue, e.g. church, under the supervision of the class teacher. If you are unsure whether a DBS check is needed, please speak to a member of the office team or to your child's class teacher.

If you would like to help in school, please pick up a Volunteer Helper application form from the foyer outside the office (peach coloured paper).

In order to keep your DBS current, you will need to sign into the 'Visitor's signing in book' (located at the office) every **three months**. If you don't sign in within this time, your DBS will expire and you will need to go through the process of applying for a new one before you can help in school again.

It is your responsibility to remember to sign in regularly and keep your DBS current.

Packed lunches

A reminder, please that packed lunches should not include fizzy drinks, sweets or chocolate bars

Nut Awareness Policy

Please note the following extremely important information for packed lunches:

- Please do not include any portions of nuts
- No nutella or peanut butter sandwiches
- No pesto pasta with pine nuts or similar nut ingredients incorporated.

With this in mind, we take the opportunity to remind parents/carers that the invitation to bring a KS2 break time snack is for **an actual piece of fruit not a cereal bar or fruit snack as** this could be a serious health risk nut allergy sufferers

Please help us to keep everyone safe by not sending these foods. For safety reasons, we will need to remove snacks that do not comply with these instructions. Thank you for your understanding in this.

Dinner Money

Dinner money is £2.30 per meal or £11.50 per week. If you think you are eligible for free school meals, please ask at the office for more details.

Please will you make every effort to pay this online using www.schoolgateway.com . If you need any information about registering for this please contact the school office.

If you are unable to access the internet then make cheques payable to **Shelford Primary School** and write your child's name on the reverse stating that the cheque is for lunch money. Thank you.

The school is not able to allow debts of more than £15. A letter will be sent if you are in debt for more than 1 week. If payment is not received then we regret that school meals will be withdrawn and you will have to provide a packed lunch until the payment is made. Thank you for your understanding in this.

The Cambridgeshire Catering Service is able to accommodate special dietary requirements in the event of a medically defined need. Please speak to the school office for the relevant form.

Medicines in school

Please be reminded that all medicines and lotions must be given to the school office staff. Pupils are not permitted to have any medicine, lotion or cough sweets in their bags or pockets during school hours.

Please fill out a form in the office if you need a medicine to be given to your child during school hours.

The school staff can only administer medicines that have been prescribed by a doctor and for which permission has been signed.
