The orchestra could face bankruptcy!</p> <p>Although a brilliant player Mark could be very absent minded. Thinking that the interval was the end he had left to play tennis. It was to be his last game. Later that night police were called to investigate his murder. Thinking that the murderer was likely to be another orchestra member who had taken revenge for situation that the orchestra was facing the police drew up a list of 32 suspects.</p> <p>Somebody knew the identity of the murderer and had left 5 clues. Each was in the form of a jigsaw. The clue was to be found on the outside of the correctly assembled jigsaw, starting with an underlined word and reading anti-clockwise. Each clue would remove half of the 32 suspects.</p> <p>Literacy skills are needed to solve each clue.</p> <p>Clue 1 -match antonyms to form a hexagon. Read the clue and remove 16 suspects from your list.</p> <p>Keep your list because clue 2 comes next Monday. Good luck!</p> <p>Clue 1 and the suspects list are separate files on the class page. You will have to print both, keep a copy of the suspects to use in the weeks to come and cut out and assemble the triangles into the correct hexagonal shape matching the antonyms.</p>	<p>No submission needed - make sure that you keep what you have done, ready for next week.</p>
