Our new Collective Worship focus is *prayer*. Each Monday, we will be exploring different aspects, thoughts and approaches to prayer. This week, we began the series by exploring prayer through spoken or written words. We used the mnemonic of a teaspoon that had been introduced to us by former members of the All Saints' team. We shared a recipe, which included teaspoons and looked at the letters that it is abbreviated to: tsp: Thank you; Sorry; Please. Children created suggestions for each of these areas to create our own prayer to close the session. Our prayer ended with asking for help in caring for our world – this links nicely to Eco Committee's fortnight.

Eco Committee

This week starts the fortnight that Eco Committee have designed to particularly prioritise three pledges, designed to support their application to Blue Peter for the Green Badge.

Bea P reminded the whole school during collective worship of our three pledges that we are focusing on:

Power – Turn off electrical appliances (incl. AC, lights etc.) when they are not being used.

Plastic – Reminding everyone to recycle at home and at school. This includes sourcing recyclable materials where possible.

Plants – Aiming to choose the green menu option more often, as this has less impact on the environment that eating meat.

A suggestion has also been taken to School Council to consider a weekly award for the most Eco Friendly Class.

Donation from Garden Club

Last week, we were delighted to receive a very generous donation of nearly £400 from Shelford Garden Club. Unfortunately, the club has now closed, but they very thoughtfully donated some of their remaining revenue to the school. For many years, the school was the venue for their meetings. We are delighted to be able to add this to the £500 from the Sawston Fun Run to develop part of the green outside of the Reception Class. Pupils have already been planning and designing this garden in their classes and through School Council.

Continued Safety Measures

Based on the Government's delay to the wider relaxation of measures, we are continuing with our Covid-safe measures in school. This includes all adults wearing face coverings when moving around site – especially at arrival and collection times. We should soon receive further guidance about how we can plan to create wider opportunities for pupils to prepare for September through the rest of this half term
