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Our focus story this week is: *Mr Impossible and the Easter Egg Hunt* (see video on the classpage)

Subject	Activity	Submission								
Phonics / Handwriting (Approx. 20-30 mins)	<p>Today, the children can revise the phoneme 'air'. Below is a suggested structure of how you could do this.</p> <p>Warm up: Sing some songs from the <u>Phonics Menu</u> (or you can sing some of your own!)</p> <p>Then, spend a short time revising phonemes and tricky words your child knows using ideas from the <u>Phonics Revision Menu</u>.</p> <p>Phonics focus: 'air'</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Introduce the phoneme 'air' - Encourage the children to say the sound and 'make' or 'write' it.- Short Reading Practice<ul style="list-style-type: none">o To practice today's phoneme, have a go playing 'Picnic on Pluto' on Phonics Play (you could also make a 'physical' form if you prefer) - Children blend words to read them and then decide if they are 'real' (for Bob) or 'fake' (for Obb!!). Click on the game, then select 'phase 3' and click on the phoneme 'air', then have fun playing!!- Short Reading Practice<ul style="list-style-type: none">o Depending on their level, you can then do a reading challenge to encourage children to apply their skills and read their own words / captions / sentences. See the 'Phonics Reading Menu' for suggestions, or Go to Phonics Play and select 'Make a Match (Phase 3 digraphs)' or 'Pick a Picture' for word level work or 'Sentence Substitution' for something a little more challenging. <p><u>Suggested words.</u></p> <table><tr><td>air</td><td>sair</td><td>chair</td><td>fair</td><td>shairn</td><td>pair</td><td>kairsh</td><td>stair</td></tr></table>	air	sair	chair	fair	shairn	pair	kairsh	stair

<p>Maths</p> <p>(Approx. 20-30 mins)</p>	<p>Warm up: Sing some songs from the <i>Maths Songs Menu</i> (or you can sing some of your own!)</p> <p>Main Activity: Watch the video 'Starting with a Story: Decorating Eggs and more, at https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/early-years/ (or you can access it offline) and follow the activities within 'Get the Activity'.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You can choose to do any of the activities suggested and spread out any other ideas over the rest of this week. Ideas include: Decorating eggs / egg and spoon races / bunny tails and making chocolate nests <p>OR Choose an activity from our Maths Menu</p>	
<p>Reading</p> <p>(Approx. 15-20 mins)</p>	<p>Try and find a time each day to practise the sounds and words that you know in your reading record. Then read a reading book / share a story book with your parents and maybe add a comment to your reading log. You could tell us:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> How you got on - was it easy / hard? What was your favourite part? OR You could draw a picture or write a comment about your book. <p>N.B. If you want some ideas for 'keeping reading alive' whilst at home, why not choose a 'reading activity' from our 'Phonics Reading Menu'.</p>
