

Dear members of the Great and Little Shelford community,

I hope this newsletter finds you and your families well. We are starting to notice that autumn is amongst us now! This week, we have been able to launch a new Collective Worship schedule, to ensure our daily collective worship continues. This is a mixture of live video link sessions, pre-recorded videos and staff-led class reflections (*see summary - right*). Each Thursday, we will focus on our new curriculum threads.
