Individual parent/ music teacher consultations and taster sessions

During SATs week (May 8th-12th) there will be no instrumentalist lessons. In their place, the music teachers will offer a consultation to parents of children who are currently registered with them and a taster session for anyone in a younger year group, who would like to try out an instrument before signing up with one of our music teachers. The choices are Woodwind (Mr Pepper), Brass (Ms Wyndham-Hall), Piano (Mr Bond), Strings (Mrs Hopkins), Guitar (Mr Boutwood), Cello (Ms Johnson), Oboe (Mr Williams). The offer is as follows:

Reception and Year 1 – no offer Year 2 – Piano or Violin Year 3 – Guitar, Cello Year 4 – Woodwind and Brass

Please be aware that places for instrument learning are limited and your child may be placed on a waiting list until a place becomes available. Children are sometimes permitted to learn two instruments but only if this is first checked with the school, so that the time out of class does not affect learning in other subjects. All children in Year 3 and Year 4 learn the recorder as part of their class music lessons.

If you would like to have this annual consultation with your child's music teacher, please contact the school office. If your child would like a taster then please also speak to the school office to arrange this.
