Music is a significant part of the identity of the school and our shared love and strength of this partly informed our inclusion of the scripture passage live in harmony, when forming our school vision. We are delighted our commitment has been recognised and look forward to continuing to develop music at Shelford, including adapting procedures to keep it alive within the current restrictions.

Year 3 are busy preparing for our annual Harvest Service. This will take place in St. Mary's church with Year 3 pupils and staff only. We will be recording the service this year so that all pupils can take part in it in their bubbles. We are aiming publish it on the school website, so that families can enjoy the service too.
