#### School Vision:

Great Shelford and Little Shelford are pleasant villages located 4 miles south of Cambridge, well placed for access to the M11. There is a railway station and trains run regularly to Liverpool Street and Cambridge. The school's catchment area includes children from both private and council housing in the villages.

Gt. & Lt. Shelford Primary School is situated in Great Shelford next to St. Mary's Church. The school maintains close and positive links with St. Mary's as well as All Saints in Little Shelford and Great Shelford Free Church.

There are currently 204 pupils on roll grouped in 7 classes.

The Reception class admits children in the September of the year in which they are 5. There are two further KS1 classes and four KS2 ones. At the age of 11 the children transfer to secondary school, usually Sawston Village College.

The Governors employ 8.6 (fte) teachers including the Headteacher, a Deputy Headteacher and a SENDco. There are 13 class based teaching assistants, 2 casual teaching assistants, 2 part-time school secretaries, 1 office manager and 14 midday supervisors. Our teaching assistants form the largest part of the lunchtime team ensuring very good continuity of care and provision at lunchtime. In addition, there are 3 kitchen staff (Leicestershire Traded services), 2 cleaners and a caretaker.

The school takes great pride in providing a friendly and caring environment for all our staff and pupils. We are fortunate in receiving considerable support from parents at all stages of their children's time here. Many of them work voluntarily in our classrooms in addition to the traditional PTA involvement. We offer a stimulating and challenging curriculum with every opportunity for individuals to excel in all fields and all classes and cater for a broad range of ability. The curriculum is organised via creative projects, which is furthered by a wide variety of extra-curricula activities. These are organised by our own staff, external providers and members of the local community and include our very popular sports teams, school





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orchestra, choir, drama and other clubs. We also have a successful breakfast club, pre-school and after school club on site.

The school has an excellent staff team with a good range of expertise. They support each other well and comment that Great and Little Shelford CE (A) Primary School is a great place to work. The school has successfully supported a long line of NQTs who have started their careers here.

### Appointment of a Teaching Assistant/Midday Supervisor
