

Flower Match-up Activity

Can you match the parts of a flower to the job they do?

Petals	The 'neck' that holds up the stigma.
Stamens	Holds up the anther.
Stigma	Contains the pollen.
Style	Brightly coloured to attract insects.
Ovary	Catches grains of pollen.
Anther	Contains the ovules.
Filament	Has two parts: the anther and the filament.
