NOW WE ARE 175

Saturday September 29th marked the 175th anniversary of Great and Little Shelford school, which is known to have opened at Michaelmas 1843. Events celebrating the anniversary began on Friday September 28th at 7:30am, when BBC Radio Cambridgeshire reporter Andy Lake arrived at the school and interviewed Head Teacher Chris Grey and PTA Secretary Matt Bell about the celebrations and how school life (and school fund-raising) has changed in 175 years. As Friday 28th also happened to be BBC Music Day, Andy Lake stayed for school choir practice in the main hall, recorded a run-through of the



choir practising 'Joshua Fit The Battle Of Jericho', and then spoke to several members of the choir about what music means to them. The interview with the Head was broadcast on BBC Radio Cambridgeshire's Breakfast show at 8:30, and the choir rehearsal at 8:50. The interviews with the children in the choir went out later in the day, on BBC Radio Cambridgeshire's Drivetime show shortly before 6pm. Friday continued with a special celebratory church service at 9:30am attended by the whole school and numerous education-related officials

from the Diocese of Ely, as well as many adults and parents from both Shelfords. After the final prayers of thanksgiving, school pupils, assisted by representatives from the school Governors and PTA, laid flowers on the grave of the first schoolmistress of Shelford School, Susannah Hopkins, in the churchyard.

From 10:30 until noon, the school was open to parents and school alumni so that Keystage 2 children could exhibit the vintage objects they have been collating since the beginning of the school year. The 'school museum' project was officially opened by Mr Grey ringing the old school bell, which is only now ever done on special occasions. The children's exhibits from the past ranged from prehistoric flint spearheads to Victorian bibles given as school prizes, old photographs, Victorian and 20th century toys and clothing, and even a vintage school cane once used for disciplining naughty pupils!

The whole school was blessed with beautifully sunny and warm early Autumn weather for the celebrations the next day, which saw the school thrown open to the public from 1:30pm. After a celebratory peal of bells from Great Shelford church, school pupils danced around the maypole at 2pm, a school tradition that verifiably dates



back to the 1890s, and possibly even all the way back to the founding of the school in 1843. The head of the school diocese (continued overleaf)

(continued from previous page) Bishop Stephen of Ely, gave an address, and then, following the



cutting of a celebratory 175th anniversary cake, helped to plant a ceremonial tree in the school grounds with assistance from some of the schoolchildren the Reverend and Simon Talbott of Great Shelford church. Inside the school, the children's historical exhibits in the main hall were joined by

a Governors' exhibit on the history of the school in the Year I classroom, where children were also invited to try using a genuine pedal-powered Victorian sewing machine. The celebrations continued in the fine weather until 4pm, with the refreshment tent proving particularly busy, Local butcher Barker Bros, who also celebrate their

175th anniversary this year and had a stand selling their limited-edition 175th anniversary sausage, sold out all of their stock. The event raised just under a thousand pounds for the school in total, getting the Governors' fundraising for the 175th year off to a fine start. The celebrations




were also covered in the Cambridge News (see: tinyurl.com/ShelfordSchool175CambridgeNews) on the following Monday.
