

Dear members of the Great and Little Shelford community,

I hope this newsletter finds you and your families well. The weather has been beautiful this week and it is difficult to believe we are heading into autumn. This week in our video link Collective

Worship, pupils explored the signs of autumn amongst God's creation. We also revisited one of our related Take 5 strategies for wellbeing – Take Notice. This is where we spend time focusing on our body's senses – for example noticing the details on apple skins or observing the changes in the leaves over time. This week, we have also been delighted to continue to work with children in school on their new topics and curriculum areas.

As you may remember, teachers redesigned the curriculum last year. We designed a specific curriculum tailored to our school, that links to our vision and ties our topics together. This means that all children in the school are currently focusing on a topic that links to 'identity' (see below).
