

# What is the story of Yom Kippur?


- When the Israelite's left Egypt, they went to Mount Sinai. Moses climbed to the top of the mountain and God gave him two tablets with the Ten Commandments on them.
- The first commandment told people that they should not worship anyone other than God. However, when Moses went down the mountain, he found the Israelites worshiping a golden calf.
- Moses was so angry that he threw the sacred tablets on the floor and they shattered. The Israelites then atoned for their wrongdoing. God forgave them and gave Moses a second set of tablets.

# Fen Tools with Ely Museum

### Potato Spoon

Used for scooping potatoes into sacks.
The slots would allow soil and small stones to fall through.

#### Pig Tail Weeder

The screw shaped end lets you twist into the root of the weed and pull it out.

#### Hay Rake

With sharp teeth and a long handle, this rake was used to gather the hay after it had been cut

# Bird Scarer

This rattle makes a loud noise & was used to scare the birds away and stop them stealing the seeds.

# Clay Spade

Used for digging clay.
The hole would reduce
the weight of the tool
and clay is sticky
enough not to fall
through.

# Bean Dibber

Used for making a small hole to plant seeds that need to be planted underground rather than sown on top of the soil.

# Sharp Shovel

A sharp shovel, sometimes known as a Hodding spade, is used for cutting ditches and rivers to drain the fields.

# Slubber

A slubber, also known as a water scoop is used to scoop the "slub" (a build up of wet clay) from ditches and dykes to keep them flowing.
