Reading	<p>Silent Reading Please read your book for 30 minutes. When reading try to use the VIPERS skills that you have been learning this year.</p>	None required
Spelling	<p>Get somebody to test you on the words from last week - in a random order of course. If you didn't manage to submit your results from last week you can send these as well.</p>	Please submit your test result so that I can update the records
Numeracy	<p>As you have been working with decimals recently there is practice in the addition and subtraction of decimals. The decimal walls increase in difficulty - you can choose one of them, two of them or all three if you wish. You will find decimal walls 1, 2 and 3 on the class page. They are organised in difficulty as shown below. Take care - you need to get all 10 walls on a page correct or you will not find the correct final answer.</p> <p>Wall 1 uses only 1 place decimals. Wall 2 uses mostly 2 place decimals Wall 3 uses only 2 place decimals</p>	Please submit the one that you completed, or if you did more than one submit the most difficult.
Literacy - grammar	<p>Murder Mystery - Death in the Orchestra</p> <p>The answer to clue three gave the time that the killer had been with the orchestra.</p> <p>Clue 4 is idiomatic language. You will find clue 4 on the class page and again you will need to print it. This time the shape is a square</p> <p>Remember to update your suspects list. Clue 5 will come next week.</p> <p>Clue 4 and the suspects list are separate files on the class page. You will have to print clue 4, assemble the pieces into the correct rectangular shape and update your suspects list.</p>	No submission but remember to update the suspects list - you are getting very close to finding the murderer!
