My tip is to be systematic and organised

Consecutive numbers investigation

I have been thinking about the sum of 2 consecutive numbers. I started by randomly adding pairs of consecutive numbers.

$$1+2 = 3$$

$$4+5 = 9$$

$$8+9 = 17$$

This is not very systematic but already I might be able to make a generalisation about what sort of numbers can be made by the addition of 2 consecutive numbers. Explore the idea of adding pairs of consecutive numbers and see which numbers you get. Write down anything that you notice. Try to do this in a systematic and organised way. See if you can find all the numbers up to 50 which can be made in this way.

Now for those of you who like extra challenges here is something a bit trickier! 9 and 12 can be made using three consecutive numbers.

$$2 + 3 + 4 = 9$$

$$5 + 6 + 7 = 18$$

Again explore the numbers to 50. Which can be made using 3 consecutive numbers? Can you see any patterns? Write about anything that you notice.

If you have done both the above can you make a generalisation about the numbers that you will get using 4 (and maybe more) consecutive numbers? Test your idea - were you correct?

Please submit any work that you have done and any conclusions or generalisations that you have made.
