

New Year, New Changes

Welcome back and a Happy New Year! I hope that you will all, by now, have received and read the letter I sent last Thursday to inform you of my decision to leave the school at the end of the school year. I am re-locating to be near to family, including my three grandsons, two of whom have been born in the last few months. Being five hours away from them is too far to be able to see them regularly enough.

It has been good to talk with the children over recent days, formally and informally to answer their questions and to reassure them about this change. I loved the idea shared by one child that I could work remotely and be the headteacher by via skype but, unfortunately I don't think that the Governors would agree that it is practical enough!

Further Changes

It sometimes happens in the life of a school that events/plans converge and, in the last few days, I have received notifications of three resignations from teachers. These decisions were made before they knew about my decision.

Mrs Mitchell will be leaving us at Easter, due to her husband's job relocation to Harrogate and Mr Paduano and Mrs Jenkins are leaving full-time teaching at the end of the school year for a healthier work-life balance. I am grateful to Mrs Jenkins and Mr Paduano for declaring their intentions earlier than they needed to so that the school can prepare in good time for the changes to staffing. I am sure that you will join me, when the time is right in thanking these staff members for their excellent contributions.

Please be assured that we will be working diligently to recruit the best teachers to these roles in the next few weeks and months. Please do not hesitate to contact me, or catch me outside in the mornings if you have any questions.

Other news

A number of governors and I were pleased to have a positive meeting with Heidi Allen just before the Christmas break. We specifically raised the issues of the inadequacy and inequality of school funding, the pressure on schools of finding £6,000 to support each child with Special Needs, the idiosyncrasies of some aspects of assessment and the need to preserve and protect a view of the reception class experience that understands the needs of young children. Heidi listened well and assured us that she would represent our views in appropriate ways at the appropriate time to the Secretary of State and others.

With Jamie Oliver and Sally Gunnell on the news over the last few days to stress the importance of health, healthy eating and well-being education for children, I am pleased to remind you that a Funtrition programme, explicitly teaching these things has been taught across the school by Mr Spencer since September.
