Update from the Governing Board

The school's Governing Board met remotely last week for the fourth of our six annual full Board meetings. We were encouraged to hear how successful the return to school has been and how much joy it brings when the school is full and functioning in the ways it is designed. We are so grateful to families and the community for their support of the pupils and staff through all the changes in the last few months. We agreed that hopefully closures are now behind us and we can look forward to a gradual reintroducing of elements of 'normality' over the next term.

A number of governors had attended training in the last half term. Some had zoomed into the Annual Governor Conference which was reported to be an excellent event with many timely and thought-provoking sessions. We also heard brief reports from a training session around increasing the effectiveness of 'Link Governor' roles. This is where each governor is linked to a subject area in school and liaises with the staff subject leader around the aims, curriculum and impact of the subject for learners. Governors do not necessarily have education backgrounds, so our role is not to check or oversee what the school are doing, but to ask questions to ensure that the decisions and choices made by the school are working in the best interests of all pupils and that effective progress is being made.

We continue to be self-evaluative as a normal part of our practice as a Board, and spent time considering questions around the clarity and effectiveness of the school's strategic priorities and vision. We also discussed the effectiveness of our engagement with the community, and acknowledged that the restrictions of the past year may have impacted this. We do aim to be as involved in the life of the school as we can, approachable and open about the work of governance. Hopefully when we are again able to have school fairs, parent briefings and inperson celebrations at school, we can be more visible again. In the meantime, please know the lines of communication are open and we are always contactable through the school office or chaireshelfordschool.org.uk

Following a short but tactful break, Alison took on the oversight of Shelford School. Her upcoming retirement this summer therefore brings to an end not only a 33 year relationship with Shelford School but almost 45 years working for the Local Authority in Cambridgeshire.
