| Our role /intention. Teachable moment | How/when we could do this |

| I commented | Extending language/thinking out loud |
| I modelled I demonstrated | Using a new resource, technique or language e.g. language to describe thinking to support children to think about their learning. Applying knowledge e.g. knowledge of counting, letter sounds or UoW |
| I asked I wondered | Posing a problem to encourager deeper thinking or involvement. It could be part of modelling thinking out loud as you and a child explore a problem together. |
| I helped I supported | Helping a child to do something so that they can see an idea through and continue to engage in the activity |
| I explained | Providing information linked to child's activity/interest that increases their knowledge/understanding. |
| I encouraged | Supporting children to negotiate conflicts, agree rules or find a way to take turns. Offering emotional support so that a child feels okay to have a go at something new. |
| I introduced I suggested | Giving new information to extend an activity e.g. suggesting that there is a fire in the woods when children are playing firefighters. |
| I provided | Providing additional resources or suggesting the right resources for the task the child is trying to complete. It could be getting a book or a laptop to find out information a child is looking for e.g. what a rabbit eats |
