

Year 1 Phonics

In each of our phonics lessons we revisit the graphemes taught in previous lessons; this involves reading them alone and in words.

We have been working on reading and writing words with adjacent consonants such as:

CVCC words	CCVC words	CCVCC	Polysyllabic words
pond	frog	stand	driftwood
list	trip	crisp	twisting
went	spot	trust	printer

These words can also contain the digraphs the children have previously been taught:

champ	green	crunch	
theft	smell	shrink	
tenth	fresh	drench

Go to resources, choose a game and select Phase 4.

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We also continue to revise the tricky and high frequency words that were taught in Reception. Being able to recognise these on sight helps to build fluency in reading. Children should also learn to spell these words which gives them more confidence when writing independently. You could focus on learning the spelling of a couple of words at a time.
