<p>'er' in the middle of words:</p> <p>stern</p> <p>herbs</p> <p>servant</p>	<p>'er' at the end of words makes a slightly different sound:</p> <p>hammer</p> <p>farmer</p> <p>bigger</p>
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<p>The most common pronunciation of 'ch':</p> <p>chip</p> <p>chin</p> <p>chops</p>	<p>'ch' can make a 'c' sound:</p> <p>Chris</p> <p>school</p> <p>Christmas</p>	<p>It can also make a 'sh' sound:</p> <p>chef</p> <p>chalet</p> <p>machine</p>
