Science Spot

Look out for the Science **Competition! Bio for January's Stem** Ambassador Talk: Molecular biologist

I am a molecular biologist, which means I study the tiny building blocks which make up all living things. My work is trying to understand how a germ, a bacterium called tuberculosis, can infect our bodies and what the cells in our bodies do to fight back. We use microscopes to watch what happens in cells when they are infected with bacteria. and we can see lots of molecules using different coloured dyes. We use a tiny fish, called a zebrafish, as a model for what happens to humans when we get germs. These fish are completely see through when they are young, which allows us to watch cells and the germs interact. We can treat the fish with the same medicines doctors give to patients, to see how the medicines work and what happens when they don't work.
