Dear Parents and Carers,

While our journey through Lent isn't quite over, we are drawing to the close of our Spring Term and will be leading our Easter Service this afternoon at All Saints, Little Shelford. To mark our journey through Lent, we have continued a variety of events in response to Bishop Stephen's Lenten Challenge. The key theme for this challenge is for members of the school community to engage with people of different generations. I have been very pleased to see how the staff have embraced this and organised a variety of activities:

- 7 whole-school Collective Worship sessions linked to the challenge, including visitors;
- Pupils leading Collective Worship at Great Shelford Free Church;
- Live Library event, where visitors 'were the books';
- Year 2 and Reception hosting and interviewing Grandparents in school;
- Tomorrow, Year 4 will visit the friendship group at the community room.

It has been fantastic to see the variety of events that have taken place and to witness the interactions between members of different generations. I am also pleased to see how many members of the wider community have been involved in our school's response to the challenge. Thank you to all the staff for their involvement, especially Miss McLoughlin for coordinating the challenge.

One of the main messages that the pupils, staff and governors felt was central to the aspirational vision of the school was the idea of community. Thank you to all of the parents who have taken part in the survey relating to the draft vision. We are in the process of setting up a small working party, made up of different stakeholders of the school community. Please let me know if you would be interested in representing parental views in this group. For our school, our vision must be founded on scripture; apply to all members of the school community and must be aspirational. The pupils, governors and staff have selected four key passages that they feel are important. This is where the draft vision has stemmed from. Staff have also reviewed the 'Star Values' in-line with the draft vision, which encapsulate the surface-level behaviours for learning and qualities we promote for academic progress:



The four words around the outside were chosen as they summarise all the aims of the current 'Star Values'. The inside of the star contains the 'Secrets of Success' that the pupils currently focus on each term. We are hoping to launch this soon, alongside the new vision.

A group of people who have already demonstrated the qualities of being a Great and Little Shelford Star are those children who performed in the instrumentalists' concerts last week! I was astounded with the quality of the performances, some of which can be heard at:

You may have seen news relating to the low funding of schools in Cambridgeshire recently. This culminated in a march of protest on Monday 1<sup>st</sup> April in Cambridge. I have not publicly mentioned this previously because I recognise the outstanding support the school receives from the dedicated parents, including the funds raised by the PTA. In addition, you will recall that the Governors' Support Fund received a very generous donation from one family and since then they have received another very generous donation from a different family. Obviously, it is imperative that these funds are used to enrich opportunities for our pupils in school, which is why they are held separately to the school's funds. Sadly, the school's income is dropping this financial year by around £7,000 despite widely publicised messages that the government are increasing school funding. The Governors and I thank you for your continued support and felt we should raise awareness of the continuing difficulties that schools face in their low level of funding.

I would like to thank all of you who were able to attend the class briefings this term. Our final class briefing takes place on Friday for Year 5. Thank you to all the class teachers for their preparation of their presentations, activities and, of course, the performances they prepared for the pupils to introduce our Celebration Collective Worship.
