

Dear members of the Great and Little Shelford community,

Welcome back to the second half of the autumn term. I hope that you and your families enjoyed a restful break and were able to make the most of the drier days of the week! It has been fantastic to welcome the children back this week and see their enthusiasm continue for the new curriculum topics - whether continuing with one from Autumn 1 or commencing a new one this half term. Our thread for this half term is 'Our story so far'.

Just before half term, Y2 held their annual 'Great Fire' linked to their topic that explored a significant event that shaped the identity of our country – the Great Fire of London. We

welcomed our History Link Governor, Gillian Scahill to observe this memorable event. Gillian said, *"It was great listening to the obvious enjoyment of the children, both Yr 2 and Yr 3 but also the understanding and involvement they demonstrated from a very safe distance."* We were extremely impressed with their understanding of the reasons for the original fire spreading so quickly, along with other facts they had acquired throughout their topic and virtual visit to the Museum of London.

Y1 have also completed their DT projects linked to identity with their 'fruit faces'. Pupils tasted and evaluated a variety of fruit, expressing their preferences, before making their fruit faces (photos *below*).

In other topics linked to the identity of our country Y3 explored 'What happened in 1066?' This explores how the identity of the country was shaped in a specific historical event. You will have already seen the Castles Day that took place earlier in the term. Pupils have also gone on to make castles with

opening and closing drawbridges; made swords and shields, using these to re-enact the Battle of Hastings. Finally, they wrote recounts of the events of the battle. It seems that George had the role of King Harold – but rest assured that no arrows entered any eyes!



In a similar history-vein, Y4 continue with their 'Romans' topic through the threads of identity and our story so far. In this, they explore ancient Roman civilisation and the Roman Empire's invasion on Britain. They enjoyed their virtual visit to the Museum of Ely, complete with artefacts (*left*), exploring

Roman battle formations and exploring the events around Boudicca's victories and eventual defeat. I was also delighted to be involved in a time-travelling video call, playing the role of a Celtic warrior!



Y5 have been exploring the identity of our world through their 'Stargazers' topic. They have explored different theories in history about the solar system, holding debates about whether it is a geocentric or heliocentric system. They have also made models of the solar system, exploring the relative sizes.

Y6 pupils have looked at the ideas of human and animal identity through the lens of Darwin's voyage and exploring themes and sharing views around creation and evolution. This has drawn

links across science, RE, geography and history. Of course, they further explored the idea of identity and belonging through their visit to Grafham Water (*below*).
