Sport Premium Funding 2015-16

Sport Premium funding, also known as Olympic Legacy funding, for Physical Education and School Sport has been provided by the government in March 2013. This is a substantial sum of £150m per year, which goes directly to schools. It is a 'ring-fenced' fund so that schools decide what is best for their children's needs, with the aim of improving the quality of provision in every state primary school in England. It is only to be spent on PE and sport and can vary from specialist coaching and teacher training to dedicated sports programmes, Change4Life sport clubs and support for after-school or weekend competitions.

Great and Little Shelford - Summary of funding and spending.

The detail for 2015-16 is as follows:

- Weekly CPD/team teaching for teachers alongside Premier Sport coaches.
- Premier Sports weekly lunchtime activity session for children, e.g. training for football referees, young leaders and encouraging sportsmanship in specific groups of children.
- Premier Sports after school tournaments club.
- School Sports Partnership membership, providing access to county tournaments.
- Balanceability training for Reception children (balance and co-ordination programme).
- 5-a-day fitness programme for all classes.
- Replacing resources, e.g. basketball post, tennis balls, rugby balls etc.
- Awards for participation including Shelford Blue badges and sports day cups.
- Cost of coaches to transport pupils to county games and tournaments.

The school also works closely with cluster schools to facilitate festivals and competitions for every year group.

The impact of this funding is measured through:

- The progress of the children in the skills outlined in the National Curriculum.
- Direct feedback by teachers on the quality of INSET and courses provided.
- Annual audit with Premier Sport.
- The number of children engaging in inter-school sporting activities.
- The number of children attending a sports club in school.

PE is a strength of the school, both in the quality of teaching and learning during school sessions and the varied and well attended extra-curricular activities it offers. The profile has been raised in recent years including weekly feedback to our Celebration Assembly. This year's highlights include:

- Reaching the county finals in Tag-Rugby and Athletics.
- 2nd place in Cambridgeshire Tennis Tournament.
- 2nd and 3rd place in Cambridgeshire Girls and Boys Football Tournaments.
- Whole School participation in School Sports Day.
