

Meet the teacher evening

Please also see the *homework policy* which has been updated with changes for this year. Please do read the policy statement and contact me if you have any questions. I can talk about this more, if there is interest, in the forthcoming Autumn Term parent briefings.

"Be Organised"

As shared with you at the *Meet the Evening*, we would like to help the children to improve in their care and respect for their own clothing items whilst on the school site. While a good number of children can be guided to look after their things, the overwhelming number of items left in the lost property box at the end of last year (5 black sacks) proves that certain children are regularly abandoning their things, especially following after school clubs. Inevitably, this causes repeated inconvenience for parents and the repeated expense of replacing items. At school, we can sometimes experience the inappropriate expectation from children that someone else will pick up their things for them and for some children there is little concern shown to reclaim items that are lost. The time taken by cleaning, caretaking, teaching and support staff to manage this issue has become unacceptable as it uses up valuable time that could be spent on learning and/or other responsibilities.

We would therefore be grateful for your support in helping your child to:

- 1. learn to carry their own things to school, and to expect them to come out of school with the same number of items.
- 2. ensuring that all clothing items are labelled. Iron-on labels seem to be the best and stand the test of time.

In turn, at school, we will be having random labelling checks in school, with those children who are "well- labelled" being rewarded with house points and those who are not, made to write in their name so that if the item is subsequently lost, it can be quickly returned. We will also provide jumper boxes that will be taken outside with the children at playtime and lunchtimes so that items can be stored in the box when necessary.

The school council debated this issue with their class councils last term and made the following decisions. Please do help your child to follow these tips:

Decisions from the School Council Challenge July 2017:

How can we encourage children to better look after their jumpers and clothes and the school's equipment e.g. pens, pencils and rulers?

- All children should leave unworn jumpers on pegs or in the class jumper boxes.
- A box will be taken out at playtime for each year group to put jumpers in if they get hot.
- All clothes need to be clearly labelled. Ideally labels will be sewn, ironed or stuck into clothes rather than written in ink. A reminder will go out in the newsletter along with suggested suppliers for labels.
- Teachers will have random 'Labelling/checking days'. The whole school will check their belongings to make sure they are clearly labelled and the names have not faded. It was suggested that these checks might be on a Friday afternoon.
- It was suggested a notice could go on the school gates e.g. 'Have you remembered all of your things?'
- School Council discussed whether it was better to punish people for losing or not labelling their belongings by removing or freezing house points; or to reward people with bonus house points for taking care of their belongings by knowing where they were at any time and having them clearly labelled.
- School Council voted unanimously (16 votes) to adopt the positive strategy of rewarding bonus house points to any children who have all their clothes clearly labelled on the random 'Label Checking Days' and all their belongings are in the right place (e.g. on clothes peg or in bag)
- Harmony and Emi volunteered to write a message to the parents informing them of the changes for September and asking for their help with labelling their children's clothes.

Message from Harmony and Emi (School Councillors 2016 – 2017)

Dear Parents and Carers,

Please can you help the school council with an important job! Please sew in a label or put a name in their school clothing. Last year the lost property box was huge. This year we are going to change that.

Vacancies

I am once again advertising the caretaker and midday supervisor vacancies. Please find the adverts attached. Please do forward them to anyone you know who may be interested. Current staff are working extra hard to cover these responsibilities but we really need to fill these essential posts as soon as possible.

The possible teaching assistant vacancy I suggested at the end of last academic year was able to be filled temporarily by our existing teaching assistant staff. This situation will be reviewed at the end of this term and a decision will be taken as to whether to advertise for an extra permanent teaching assistant. In the meantime, I would like to recruit a number of "casual teaching assistants." The application process, induction and CPD would be exactly the same as for a permanent Teaching Assistant but the hours of work would be on an ad hoc basis, as and when cover is required for unexpected TA absences or TA attendance at training events or meetings. This role would suit someone who is an aspiring teaching assistant who would like the opportunity to train alongside our own excellent team. You should be aware that, should a permanent post become available, it will need to be advertised in the usual way and that unfortunately having become a casual teaching assistant will not benefit your application, except of course in the experience and training you will have received in the process. Please note that all our teaching assistants are also required to cover midday supervision.

DBS checks

As we begin a new school year, it is a good time to remind parents/carers and our volunteer helpers about the following very important aspect of the schools Safeguarding procedures.

All volunteer helpers are required to:

- be DBS checked by the school, even if you already hold a DBS certificate from somewhere else.
- attend an induction session with Mrs Evans prior to helping within the school. (Dates for induction sessions for this year will be published in the newsletter at a later date).

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The exception to this is if you are helping to walk children to an outside venue, e.g. church. If you are unsure whether a DBS check is needed, please speak to a member of the office team or to your child's class teacher.

If you would like to help in school, please pick up a Volunteer Helper application form from the foyer outside the office (peach coloured paper).

In order to keep your DBS current, you will need to sign into the 'Visitor's signing in book' (located at the office) every <u>three months</u>. If you don't sign in within this time, your DBS will expire and you will need to go through the process of applying for a new one before you can help in school again.

It is your responsibility to remember to sign in regularly and keep your DBS current.

If you are already DBS checked and haven't signed in since June, please remember that you will need to do this soon. Please check with the office if you are unsure.

Packed lunches

A reminder, please that packed lunches should not include fizzy drinks, sweets or chocolate bars

Nut Awareness Policy

Please note the following extremely important information for packed lunches:

- Please do not include any portions of nuts
- No nutella or peanut butter sandwiches
- No pesto pasta with pine nuts or similar nut ingredients incorporated.

With this in mind, we take the opportunity to remind parents/carers that the invitation to bring a KS2 break time snack is for **an actual piece of fruit not a cereal bar or fruit snack as** this could be a serious health risk nut allergy sufferers

Please help us to keep everyone safe by not sending these foods. For safety reasons, we will need to remove snacks that do not comply with these instructions. Thank you for your understanding in this.

Dinner Money

Dinner money is £2.30 per meal or £11.50 per week. Year 3 parents please be aware that free school meals are no longer available for your children unless eligible through Cambridge County Councils 'Count me in Scheme'. If you think you are eligible please ask at the office for more details.

Please will you make every effort to pay this online using <u>www.schoolgateway.com</u>. If you need any information about registering for this please contact the school office.

If you are unable to access the internet then make cheques payable to **Shelford Primary School** and write your child's name on the reverse stating that the cheque is for lunch money. Thank you.

The school is not able to allow debts of more than £15. A letter will be sent if you are in debt for more than 1 week. If payment is not received then we regret that school meals will be withdrawn and you will have to provide a packed lunch until the payment is made. Thank you for your understanding in this.

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The Cambridgeshire Catering Service is able to accommodate special dietary requirements in the event of a medically defined need. Please speak to the school office for the relevant form.

Medicines in school

Please be reminded that all medicines and lotions must be given to the school office staff. Pupils are not permitted to have any medicine, lotion or cough sweets in their bags or pockets during school hours.

Please fill out a form in the office if you need a medicine to be given to your child during school hours.

The school staff can only administer medicines that have been prescribed by a doctor and for which permission has been signed.
